INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The Fund seeks to achieve long-term growth of capital. The Fund's investment advisor, GoodHaven Capital Management, focuses on a few carefully chosen companies whose securities appear significantly undervalued. Most often, these are strong and enduring businesses, run by exceptional owner/managers. We may also pursue other value investing strategies such as those related to risk arbitrage, spin-offs, and companies in bankruptcy. We are not constrained by geography, sector, industry, or market capitalization in seeking out sensible investments.

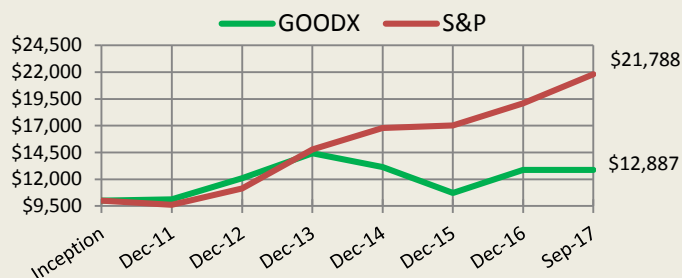
